



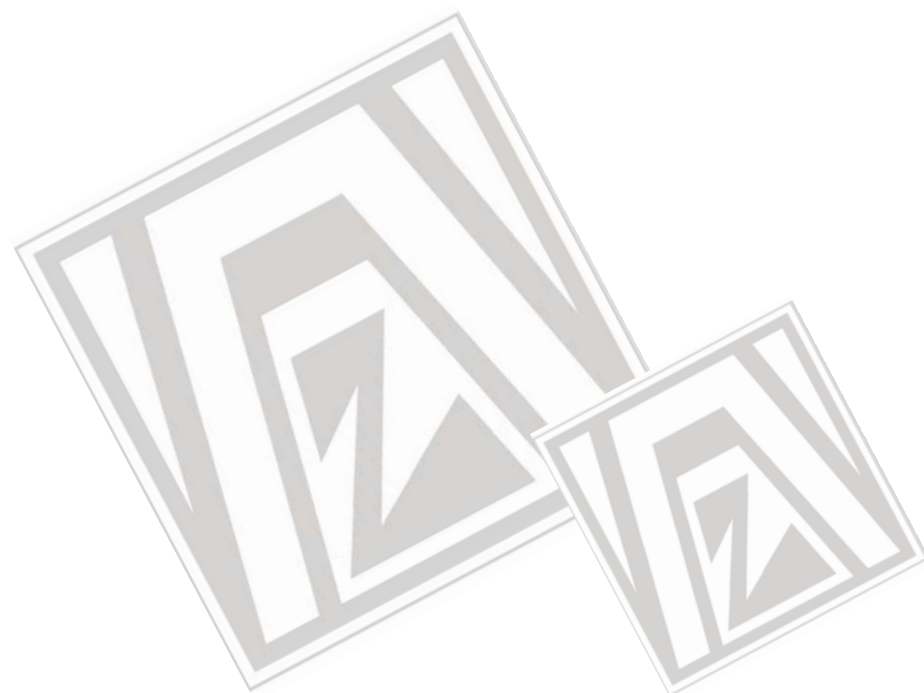

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2005-2006

As the 2005/06 financial year draws to an end, it is time to reflect on the growth and achievements of the club over the past year.

My Presidency began on a very steep learning curve and I am most appreciative of the expertise, patience and efforts of the Club in supporting me this past year.

Despite the many issues experienced by a number of Board members this year, the club has continued to test the boundaries and grow, yet we have remained focused on the goals of the 2004-2006 Biennium:

Focus on the Mission

We have promoted a greater understanding of Zonta International through strong club attendance at the Founder's Day Dinner, the Area 3 Workshop hosted by the Dunsborough Clubs and the District 23 Conference in September 2005, hosted by Glenelg, was a highlight of the past year. It was a most successful conference, attended by a third of the Members of the Club.

A number of members will be attending the International

Convention in Melbourne in June. Promotion of the Zonta website registration has also been successfully executed.

Combine Service and Advocacy

Our club once again provided financial support for the production of breast cushions and 2 birthing kit workshops were ably coordinated by Deb Hegarty with over 1,000 kits assembled at each workshop.

Our club co-sponsored the TAFE/ Bandyup Prison Beauty Therapy course, and organised holiday accommodation in Albany for needy families via the Holiday Trust, thanks to Sharee van den Berg for coordinating this program.

Our club has provided ongoing support of the Zonta House crisis centre and we congratulate Marg Giles for 13 years of dedicated service and Lori Grech on her appointment to the Zonta House Board.

We have further enhanced our partnership with the Ngarinyin community this past year by providing support and guidance to the community and in particular Yvonne Burgu's recent art exhibition. As outlined in the Ngarinyin committee report, this

extremely successful art exhibition funded the purchase of a 4 wheel drive vehicle and has had a profound impact on the Mt Barnett, Gibb River and surrounding communities.

Recruit, Retain and Rejuvenate

The successful new member's information evenings hosted by the Membership and Support committee have resulted in five new members, with two further members to be inducted prior to the AGM.

Unfortunately we have had two resignations and another member transferred to Zonta Swan Hills club.

Two members have taken extended leave of absence this year - Yvonne Roberts a founding member and Marilyn Piper have been unable to attend meetings due to ill health, our thoughts are with you, their valuable contribution to club business and activities have been greatly missed.

The selection of the University Club as our club venue was a challenge for the Membership and Support Committee and I would like to acknowledge Linley Buchanan and Lennie McCall for their commitment and coordination.

The format and content of meetings have been under constant scrutiny as we attempt to source relevant speakers, balance fellowship with business and provide information and stimulation to Members. Sharee van den Berg's attention to detail in staging the monthly dinner meetings has been greatly appreciated.

A successful half-day planning session facilitated by Ron Kemp in November was attended by 12 members. This workshop highlighted the range of attitudes and expectations of our Zonta membership. As a result the club is well placed to plan the future growth and development in 2006/07.

Many of the club's current practices have been challenged this year and the relevance and sustainability of our projects reviewed.

As a result of members' feedback, there has been a concerted effort to consolidate the club projects this year and this has led to a feeling of renewed enthusiasm.

As a result of our successful application for a Lotterywest grant of \$10,500, our club was able to co-sponsor the CompetitiveEdge International Women's Day, by funding over 300 high school students to attend the Lunch Box

Holiday trust

Despite the efforts of Sharee Van den Berg to keep the holiday program alive, only one holiday was booked during 2005 and at the last minute had to be cancelled due to the ill health of a family member about to embark on the holiday. Sharee has found it increasingly difficult to obtain the use of Friendship House in Albany due to the number of holidays already booked by the Albany Rotary Club.

Education Award

Thanks to the commitment of Roslyn Budd and her team, this award has attracted 21 applications for the 2005/2006 year. The closing deadline for the award was extended to March 2006 and interviews are due to be held prior to Easter. The winner will be presented to the club at the May meeting.

Central TAFE Community Services Award

Only one award was presented during 2005 and this went to Loretta Hynes who is studying Certificate IV in Community services, Mental Health (Non Clinical) at Central TAFE. Marilyn Piper, although not a member of this committee, has liaised regularly with Central TAFE and in my absence presented the award to the Winner at a morning tea organised by TAFE. Ian Laing from Central TAFE has requested that the Club provide a letter of support for accreditation of the Aboriginal Mentoring Program for which TAFE received grant funding approval in October 2005.

Guides WA Leadership Award

Dr Emma Lalor was the recipient of the 2005 Guide Leader Award. As a member of WA Olave (Program Committee), Emma is recognised for her support and enthusiasm for promoting Guiding to women and girls over the past 11 years. TREASURER'S REPORT

Our club continues to have a healthy bottom line. While our fundraising activity yielded a little less than forecast, our careful expenditure resulted in a sound financial result for the year.

Other notable achievements in terms of financial reporting, include the clearing of the backlog from an auditing perspective.

Our auditor, Reg Holmes, has audited figures for the last four years and all is in order. He has provided the club with wise counsel about areas for improvement in terms of ensuring the accuracy of the final statement that is printed in the Annual Report.

As the sources of funds have become more varied with the cards and the Ngarinyin project, the difficulty of tracing the funding source and purpose if not clearly stipulated on the envelope has become more problematic. Collecting money at the door for each meeting has proven helpful to identify all details of money collected at the meeting.

The loss incurred for catering at meetings has been caused by the

cost of guest speakers and the champagne at the Christmas function.

A special thanks is due to 'Tricia Summerfield for her guidance and support on financial matters, Lyn McArthur for her leadership and the board and members for their support during a year in which the loss of our immediate past Treasurer resulted in an increased need for the support of the Club in ensuring that I had complete information.

budget, the club is still in a strong financial position to meet its service commitments.

This year's fundraising efforts will continue to fund our service projects including Club projects: TAFE Education Award, Tertiary Education Award, Zonta Holidays, Zonta House Refuge Association and Guides WA; District 23 projects: Breast Cancer Cushions and Birthing Kits; as well as our commitment to International Service Projects and the Amelia Earhart Fellowship.

A proposal to raise funds by product endorsement, introduced by Sciona Browne, was submitted through the District Governor to the International President for in-principle approval but received only a verbal indication of non-support.

There were many challenges on the finance side with Mary Gurgone taking on the Treasurer's position as a "raw recruit"; she put in a sterling effort and will close the Zonta financial year with balanced books.

Club members have been very supportive of our committee and we thank everyone for their efforts in selling tickets, providing refreshments and helping to run the fundraising events.

Sincere thanks to the members of the committee and the many "Hon Zons" (husbands and partners) for their support, enthusiasm and efforts throughout the year.

**NGARINYIN PROJECT
Karen Groves**

This has been an important year of awareness-raising and vision-setting in what is proving to be a unique, sustainable and worthwhile project.

Awareness-Raising

Public recognition of this project and the relationship between the "Zonta Mob" and the "Ngarinyin Mob" has developed greatly over this year. This is a significant achievement.

In March 2005, at the Area 3 Workshop, the Club did a power point presentation of the visit of its members to the Kimberley in 2004. Other Clubs in Area 3, along with District Governor Ronda Walker, were most interested and expressed support for the project.

In September 2005, at the District 23 Conference in Adelaide, the Club did a power point presentation featuring the relationship/partnership between the Zonta women and the Ngarinyin women – its establishment and benefits, challenges and achievements thus far. Clubs from throughout District 23 were impressed by the professionalism of the presentation and the approach the Club was taking in establishing and maintaining this partnership.

During 2005, the “wandjina, two snakes, owl and broлга” card project was launched, involving the production of 2000 note cards with envelopes, depicting Yvonne Burgu’s lovely painting which she gifted to the Club. While this is a project to raise funds to do further projects with the Ngarinyin community, sales have served well to promote the Ngarinyin Project and the link between the Club and the Ngarinyin.

Appropriate and valuable links have been made with firstly, Dr. Mary Anne Jebb, historian and art curator and now curator of the Mowanjum Art and Cultural Centre in the Kimberley, and secondly, Dr. Diane Mossenson of Indigenart. These links are important because most of the Ngarinyin women elders are significant artists and the advice and guidance of these experts in dealing with the Ngarinyin is invaluable.

The existing link with Central TAFE was strengthened when we were approached to support Central TAFE to seek accreditation to establish a “Mentoring for Aboriginal People” course. The support of the Zonta Club of Perth, being a service organization with a significant partnership with the Ngarinyin, was considered most desirable and complementary.

Ultimately, the “White Angel” project was the one which really attracted widespread public interest, enthusiasm and support for the Ngarinyin Project.

While not an official Club project, some of our members really involved themselves in this astoundingly successful venture, and in so doing, excited various sections of the wider community and achieved significant publicity for the Zonta Club of Perth and its relationship with the Ngarinyin community.

(The “White Angel” project involved Ngarinyin artist Yvonne Burgu coming to Perth to prepare an exhibition of paintings for sale in order to raise funds to purchase a badly-needed vehicle for her Gibb River community. It was a case of Zontians helping her achieve her goal and in the mean time, strengthening this wonderful relationship.)

At the conclusion of this section, it is critical to acknowledge the commitment and enthusiasm of Sciona Browne, Carole Theobald, Wendy MacGibbon and our non-Zontian friend Kathy Charlesworth to the success of much of this awareness-raising.

FINANCE AND FUNDRAISING

The Finance and Fundraising Committee has had an enjoyable and successful year. Two fundraising events were held both for fundraising purposes and to provide the opportunity for Zontians and their friends to have fun whilst assisting us to raise valuable dollars for our various service projects.

In May we held a very successful champagne and oyster event at Barbara-Dene Jones’ new riverside home in Mosman; we are indebted to BD for her creativity and enthusiasm and were very sorry to see her leave the club to pursue other interests.

Our second event was a film fundraiser at the Astor in Mt Lawley where we enjoyed the new production of *Pride and Prejudice* with about 100 members and friends.

Through these fundraising efforts we succeeded in raising \$4069 which together with funds raised by the Ngarinyin sub-committee (\$842) and bank interest (\$518) brought the Club’s total fundraising to \$5430; two thirds of the club’s fundraising target of \$8000. However with unexpended funds in the service

Advocacy when a new edition of Marilyn Piper's booklet on advocacy was available.

A project to produce a blank notelet card reproducing a Wanjina painting by Yvonne Burgu had been commenced by the PR Committee last year and this came to fruition under the guidance of the Ngarinyin Sub-Committee in time to be marketed at the Conference. Local sales were later boosted by the offer by Carole Theobald to print a Christmas greeting inside the cards as ordered.

The Committee was active in promoting registration with the Zonta International webpage and assisted members to do this until the Club achieved as full a registration as was possible. An application for a Zonta Club of Perth logo was approved by Zonta International and is now available for use.

A power point presentation has been created to showcase the Club itself and this has proved useful in promoting the Club to potential new members and can be used on any promotional occasion with variations to suit the moment.

The Club's entry in the *Directory of Australian Associations 55th edition* has been updated.

Media releases have been issued on a number of occasions with some success. Committee members are working to build media contacts through whom releases may be channeled.

The Club archives are monitored by this Committee and this year time has been spent in the Batty Library listing and advising on the accessioning of our records held there.

A flag stand bearing flags of countries where there are Zonta clubs has been refurbished and the flags checked for currency and new ones added to bring it up to date. This stand was presented to the Club by its first President Susan Fletcher in 1974 and is used for Area functions as well as at our own meetings.

The PR Committee met on eight occasions including one electronic meeting. The Committee's procedures have been documented and a PR Procedure Manual issued on CD to its members.

The Committee is fortunate to have the expertise and energy of Carole Theobald who is responsible for producing the display material, the webpage, the power point presentations, leaflets, membership

Vision-Setting

During the year it also became apparent that some brainstorming, scoping and strategic thinking about the future direction of the Ngarinyin Project needed to be undertaken. Future fundraising, financial planning, goal setting and resource allocating needed to be encompassed within the Club's strategic plan.

In November 2005, the Committee held a brainstorming day out of which came the following Vision Statement:

"An extraordinary friendship with the Ngarinyin Women."

Five goals and means of measuring their achievement were set:

- to scope/understand the needs of the Ngarinyin women from their perspective
- to remain flexible and responsive to the needs of the Ngarinyin women
- to encompass the Ngarinyin women into Zonta fellowship
- to grow the friendship with the Ngarinyin women
- to plan a realistic allocation of resources to provide the Ngarinyin women and the Club with realistic expectations

At the subsequent Club Planning Day in November 2005, one of the five Club goals was:

"To embrace the Ngarinyin Project as a significant project for the Zonta Club of Perth"

This was achieved by the Club endorsing the goals of the Ngarinyin Project Committee and giving the Ngarinyin Project full committee status.

At its February 2006 Meeting, the Committee began to work on ideas and strategies to further develop the relationship with the Ngarinyin women.

I would like to thank all members of the Committee for their sincere and steadfast contributions to the development of this unique project.
