Outstanding Guide Leader Awarded

The following media release from Guides Australia summarises the achievements of Dr Emma Lalor, recipient of the 2005 Zonta Club of Perth's Guide Leader Award—Ed.

The Zonta Club of Perth has honoured Bull Creek Guide Leader, Dr. Emma Lalor, in a presentation by the State Commissioner, Guides Western Australia, Janet Garcia-Webb, at the Guides WA State Convention. Zonta's Guiding WA Award for Inspirational Leadership recognises outstanding, individual contribution to Guiding and the community.

In accordance with Zonta's philosophy and objectives of helping advance the status of women, and recognising significant contributions by women in the community, Emma was cited for her dedication and commitment to Guiding during the past 11 years. In that time she has been the inaugural Chair of the Guides Western Australia Olave Program Committee and subsequent member, member of Guides WA Executive Committee and has participated in national Guiding events. Emma is currently a Leader of Youth at Bull Creek Guides and edits a monthly Regional newsletter.

In the citation, Guides Australia National Olave Program Committee Chair, Catherine McKinnon, noted:

"Emma is an amazing Leader who brings out the best in every girl...with an exciting and varied program. As a member of WA Olave (Program Committee), Emma has been an important part of establishing Olave as an important part of Guiding showing exceptional leadership skills for young adults."

Guides WA is part of a worldwide voluntary organisation that promotes and encourages the development of girls and women

Zonta House Refuge Association— rebuilding lives, shaping futures

The Zonta Club of Perth has a long association with the Zonta House Refuge Association. Many thanks to Gwen Bull, President of the Association, for providing this article describing this valuable community service—Ed.

The mission

Zonta House Refuge is dedicated to provide a safe and supportive environment for women in crisis.

How did it begin?

Zonta House grew from a need which was first recognized by Diane Annear, the inaugural Co-ordinator of the Refuge. After working in the Department for Family and Children's Services for several years, Di changed direction from a government to a non-government environment and worked in a refuge for women and children for 10 years.

During this time Di had many enquiries for accommodation from women who did not have dependent children in their care. In many cases these women had suffered long-term abuse, remaining in the family home only until children were no longer dependent. Lack of alternative accommodation made their position intolerable.

Di kept statistics of the number of women in this situation and as they were significant, she approached the State Government with regard to funding a refuge for this client group. However she was advised that funding would not be made available until the need for such a project had been proven.

At the time Di was a member of the Zonta Club of South Perth and she approached the Club for assistance in supporting a venture to house lone homeless women who were in crisis and who had no alternative options for accommodation.

Development of Zonta House

The Club accepted the challenge and in 1982 the first house was established at Bridgewater opposite Heathcote Hospital. Members gave their services in a voluntary capacity covering 24 hour rosters, shopping and transporting clients to appointments. The Club also contributed financially and in kind (as did members of the community) and Di worked full time in a voluntary capacity for several years. Her contribution of over 20 years cannot be over-estimated.

During the next year there were a number of setbacks but finally government funding was approved and a property at 4 Shirley Avenue, Mount Pleasant was acquired. Despite initial opposition from the local community, permission to establish a Refuge was approved by the then Minister for Local Government.

Zonta House Refuge Inc. was officially established on April 16th 1984. It provides 24 hour crisis care and houses the office for the overall

administration of the extended Refuge. Services include short-term accommodation offering full board for up to 10 clients, emotional support, financial advice, advocacy, transport, a 'clothes boutique' and assistance in obtaining permanent accommodation.

After crisis care was well-established, it became obvious that longer term accommodation was required by many clients as the limit of a short period at the Refuge was often insufficient to resolve problems.

Hence an expanded service was set up to provide medium to long-term accommodation and also to house clients who have psychiatric problems or who are associated with a drug or alcohol dependency.

Currently through co-operation with the Department of Housing & Works, there are six additional accommodation units and the total number of clients who can be accommodated exceeds 40 women.

Bateman House

This is a unique service set up by Zonta House, the Department for Community Services and the Departments of Health and Housing & Works. It accommodates 5 clients and is supervised by Zonta House staff assisted part-time by a Psychiatric Worker from Fremantle

How can I help the refuge?

Tip 1—Provide wool

If members have any knitting wool that they do not want the refuge has a knitting group which is run by Kath Snashall from Perth Northern Suburbs and they would appreciate any wool.



Hospital. It has been identified by the Mental Health Service as the preferred accommodation service within Western Australia.

Cloverdale House

Accommodates four women who have had some contact with drug or alcohol dependency and who are re-establishing their independence and future.

Shelley Houses

Two units both of which will accommodate 4 clients for a medium term prior to the clients moving on to independent living.

THE VILLAGE

In 1995 Zonta House received Government funding to build 5 x two-bedroom units to accommodate women over 55 years on a permanent basis. These units are now well-established and are sought after by former clients.

THE COTTAGES

Completed in 2004 as a joint venture between the Zonta House Inc. Association Committee of Management and the Department of Housing & Works. The two units each accommodate 2 clients on a medium-term basis.

Wongabeena

A block of 10 government owned bed-sitters most of which are occupied by Zonta House clients.

How can I help the refuge?

Tip 2—Provide toiletries

Donate toiletries (incl. combs and toothbrushes), pyjamas and nighties

The people that make it work

Since its inception, Zonta House Refuge has accommodated more than 6000 women many of whom have moved on to independent living.

Its reputation as a preferred service within the community is due largely to the vision and commitment of Di Annear who retired in July 2004, to the efforts of members of the Committee of Management and to a very dedicated staff.

Zonta House is staffed by a Manager (Ms Annette Chivers was appointed in January 2005), a Social Worker and support workers working mainly from the Crisis Centre. Former clients are often welcomed back to Zonta House and are invited to join in social functions.

Zonta House provides outreach services to clients which are not covered by government funding. Hence additional assistance is necessary to maintain our level of commitment towards the welfare of women in crisis.

Strong on-going support is received from the Zonta Clubs of Western Australia, from agencies and businesses within the community, from volunteers and through fund-raising

A voluntary recycled clothing boutique was an important project organized by Zonta House during the period 1996 – 2004. Its purposes were to provide opportunities for clients and to raise funds. Many volunteers made a significant contribution to its success.

Future direction

In July 2005 the members of the Committee of Management and the staff held a series of Strategic Planning Meetings to establish a list of Key Objectives and to develop an Action Plan for the years 2006-08.

This is an on-going process and will herald a new and exciting phase in the development of Zonta House Refuge.
