## 1. New Look Inzert

Ever feel it is time for a change? The old style Inzert, may have won many awards, but the skills required to produce it were becoming a huge barrier to sharing the editing task. So, the PR committee agreed to produce and trial a simpler format so that potentially any member could take on (and enjoy) performing the editing role.

Being the Inzert Editor is very interesting as you get to find out what is happening in our Club and in the wider Zonta world. Hopefully, the simpler format will encourage more members to think seriously about editing our newsletter.

What is special about this design?

- o The new Inzert is designed to be read on screen – hopefully saving paper and ink! The articles may be scrolled down without having to navigate around the page, as you have to do with a multi-column format.
- o The newsletter contains hyperlinks, to encourage on screen reading, so you have the option of going quickly to the appropriate web page to find out more about a topic.
- o Articles are numbered, not pages, so you can find your way through the document easily without having to search for page numbers at the top or bottom of the page!
- o The design may be printed out and still look attractive and inviting to read when it is in our archives.
- o The format does not require the editor to have special design and layout skills – it is created in Word from a specially designed template, so articles may be copied and pasted from contributor's emails directly into the newsletter. If an article finishes half way down a page, the editor is not expected to find 'fillers' to complete the page – the newsletter will stop at the end of the story!

Education Officer, Women's and Children's Health Service, Child and Community Health Directorate, Department of Health. She is committed to raising awareness of FGM as a human rights issue and is seen as a leading advocate in seeking to make FGM illegal. She migrated to Australia 18 years ago from Ethiopia and has committed her professional and voluntary life to improving the health of communities and the rights of women and children through education and advocacy.

Karen Groves, Area 3 Director, presented Martha with a specially designed gold and pearl brooch (crafted by Linney's the jewelers) and a certificate. Martha was delighted to receive the award and in her speech described her work and thanked Zontians for their recognition and support.

#### EQUALITY NOW CONDEMNS SAUDI ARABIAN COURT RULING SENTENCING RAPE VICTIM TO 200 LASHES AND 6 MONTHS' IMPRISONMENT

A 19-year-old woman from Qatif, Saudi Arabia, was brutally attacked and gang raped by 7 men approximately 18 months ago, according to media reports. While seeking justice in her case, the woman was herself sentenced in October 2006 to 90 lashes for being in the company of an unrelated man at the time of the attack. She appealed this decision to a higher court, and the Qatif General Court announced on Wednesday November 14, 2007, that the victim's sentence had been more than doubled to 200 lashes and 6 months in prison, a gross violation of human rights including the right to be free from discrimination and from torture and other cruel, degrading and inhuman treatment. Following this decision the rape victim's lawyer had his license to practice revoked. While the courts have not clarified why the sentence was increased, media reports suggest that the harsher sentence for the rape victim and the confiscation of her lawyer's license were directly related to their decision to speak with Saudi Arabian media about the injustice in this case. If true, this retaliation clearly violates the fundamental human right to freedom of expression.

Equality Now is calling on the Ministry of Justice of Saudi Arabia to immediately revoke this sentence of lashing and imprisonment of the rape victim, which is a travesty of justice. Equality Now is also calling on the Ministry to restore her legal representation by rescinding its decision to revoke the license of her lawyer. Taina Bien-Aimé, Executive Director stated,

*"This verdict by the Saudi Arabian court is blatantly discriminatory and violates several fundamental rights of the victim as well as her lawyer. We urge the Saudi Arabian authorities to undo this injustice immediately. They need to ensure that the victim is treated as a victim and not as a criminal. The international human rights community will continue to closely monitor the case and provide solidarity to advocates on the ground until the victim is safe from state sponsored violence and discrimination."*

**ACTION** -Please contact the Saudi Arabian embassy in your country, as well as your country's Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Call on these officials to convey your concern over this injustice and to take whatever action is in their power to protect this Saudi rape victim from lashing and imprisonment.

Equality Now is an international human rights organization based in New York, Nairobi and London that works to protect and promote the civil, political, economic and social rights of girls and women. She hopes to use her qualifications to help refugees who have suffered trauma, domestic violence and financial problems. In the African refugee camps she was aware that many children died because of lack of treatment and shortage of drugs.

Triphine is confident of succeeding in her studies as she is keen and attentive and attributes this in part to her fantastic teachers.

Triphine and Jacob are both studying community service subjects and would eventually, after university, like to become social workers. Our sincere congratulations go to Triphine for not only winning the Award, but also on her wedding next month to Jacob.

We wish you every happiness in your future lives together. What a team you will make!


## 5. Call to Convention
